The swing improves coordination and balance, and bilateral coordination.

Funds are requested for the purchase of a reading program for students who do not acquire reading skills through traditional methods. Phonics Blast covers explicit instruction in the foundational skills needed to help students master the skills they need to become accurate fluent readers.
